Tour 2: Sound of Music Tour Tuesday 20 June - 10.00 – 14.00

This tour is an ideal opportunity to follow in the footsteps of Maria von Trapp whilst taking in local historical sights both from the city of Salzburg and the picturesque surrounding Lakes and Mountains. The tour will stop at:

- Mirabell Gardens and the Pegasus Fountain (the dance scene with Maria and the children)
- Schloss Leopoldskron (in the film, the house where the family lived)
- Hellbrunn palace (singing scenes)
- Nonnberg Convent (where the young Maria was a novice)
- St. Gilgen / Wolfgangsee (opening scene of the movie)
- Mondsee Basilica (wedding scene)

Salzburg - City of Mozart

Surrounded by the Alps, Salzburg is a baroque city with a long history as a metropolis of the arts and culture that shaped its charm and unforgettable experience. Its small streets take visitors back in time and create the friendly and welcoming atmosphere. The historic centre of Salzburg is a UNESCO World Heritage since 1996 and protects the Old City of 236 hectares with countless attractions that lie within walking distance.

The iconic landmarks, like the impressive DomQuartier, the famous Getreidegasse with traditional shops ranging from jewellery to leather goods, the Old Marketplace and the Hohensalzburg Fortress paint a picture of a real-life fairy tale and take visitors on a magical experience.

Born in 1756, Mozart is still Salzburg's pride and treasure. The city is full of popular landmarks to visit Mozart's birth house in the Getreidegasse and the Mozart Residence.

Travelling to Salzburg

By Air

To Salzburg's W.A. Mozart Airport

Salzburg's W.A. Mozart Airport is located just minutes from the city centre. There are direct flights from major European cities and hubs, such as from Frankfurt, Dusseldorf and London.

Reaching the Imlauer Pitter Hotel from Salzburg Airport:

- Bus 2 takes you directly to the hotel. The bus stop is "Kongresshaus". Duration: 30 minutes.
- Taxis are available in front of the airport. Duration: 15 minutes. Cost: approx. €20.

Via Munich International Airport

Salzburg can also be accessed via Munich International Airport.

Reaching the Hotel from Munich Airport:

- By train: There are excellent rail connections from Munich Airport via Munich's Ostbahnhof to Salzburg Hauptbahnhof that take around 2.5 hours. Rail connections can be viewed at www.bahn.de. To book a ticket from Munich Airport to Salzburg Hauptbahnhof (Hbf), you can follow this link to purchase a Bayernticket.
- By rental car: Duration: 1.5 hours via A8 Salzburg-Munich motorway. Toll road sticker is required from the Walserberg border onwards and can be bought at the border or petrol stations.
- By Salzburger Mietwagen Service Shuttle: These shared taxi-buses can seat up to 8 passengers. Private transfers can also be arranged. For more information – www.mietwagenservice.at

By Train

The hotel is only 600 metres from Salzburg Hauptbahnhof.

- Taxis are available in front of the train station, and take about 3 minutes, costing approx. €7.
- From the train station buses 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6 take you directly to the Imlauer Pitter Hotel. The bus stop is "Kongresshaus". Duration: approx. 5 min.

By Car

Parking is available for residents in the Imlauer Pitter Hotel garage at €18 per day. There are no traffic restrictions to access the hotel.

How to Pay

The Registration fee must be paid by bank transfer or by credit card. Please ensure that you pay any charges levied by your bank so that these are not debited to the event account. Details on how to make your payment will be given at the end of your online registration process. If you choose to pay by bank transfer, download your invoice at the end of your registration and make payment immediately.

Visas

Delegates requiring visas for entry into Austria are asked to apply for their visas at their local Austrian Embassy as soon as possible. If letters of invitation are required, please contact EGGA. Please allow sufficient time for the authorities to process your visa application.

VAT

EU law obliges the organisers to charge VAT in the country in which the event is held. Austrian VAT of 20% is added to the delegate registration fees. EU-registered companies will be able to reclaim this VAT and should include their VAT registration number when registering. Non-EU companies may also be able to reclaim Austrian VAT if a reciprocal refund agreement exists with their country and other conditions are met. Austrian VAT is not applicable to sightseeing tours (Tours 1 and 2) and visits to galvanizing plants (Groups 1 and 2). These items are not in the scope of EGGA's VAT registration in Austria but are within the scope of EGGA's domestic VAT registration where they are subject to the Tour Operator Margin Scheme (TOMS) and no VAT is added.

Cancellation: Registration and Plant Visit

- Cancellations received before 1 May 2023 full refund
- Cancellations received between 1 May 2023 and 18 May 2023 – 50% refund of fees
- No refunds will be made for cancellations received after 18 May 2023
- Substitution of delegates is permitted at any time but must be notified in advance
